  - There is also a Large Group SAG meeting proposed in mid-June, for the IL-TRM Administrator to introduce policy issues
  - To avoid ex parte concerns, SAG meetings will <u>not</u> include items at issue in open EE Plan dockets
- If the 2025 SAG Plan requires updates following Commission approval of EE Plans, updates will be discussed with utilities, interested stakeholders, and the SAG Steering Committee

- Monday, June 16 Large Group SAG Meeting: VEIC presents policy issues and requests feedback
  - a. Written comments due by Monday, June 30
- 3. **Wednesday, July 9:** Small group SAG meeting to discuss written feedback
- 4. Wednesday, July 21: Small group SAG meeting to discuss written feedback
- 5. Goal is to resolve policy issues before the IL-TRM August 1 deliverable

#### **SAG Steering Committee**

- Purpose:
  - To provide substantive feedback to the SAG Facilitator on: (1) annual SAG Plans;
     and (2) progress towards meeting annual SAG Plan goals to ensure that the time spent on SAG is as productive and valuable as possible
  - Steering Committee launched in mid-2018

Abigail Miner: I wanted to check in on the list of items VEIC identified as policy issues, as we discussed you would look at that. Have you looked?

• Celia Johnson: I will review them before the TRM meeting tomorrow. It will be very high-level, so there is still time for VEIC to follow up on these items. If needed, we can add any other policy issues to the agenda for the June 16<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Elder Calderon: Regarding policy discussions on SAG issues, do you have a timeline for process resolutions? The TRM needs to be finalized in September. When does consensus need to be reached, and what happens if it is not?

- Celia Johnson: VEIC requests that we resolve the policy issues by August 1<sup>st</sup>, but the TRM does not need to be finalized until early September. The final TRM will be filed with the Commission by October 1<sup>st</sup>, but a final deliverable will be circulated in the first week of September to check for [minor] errors or corrections. There is a specific procedure in the TRM policy document that will be followed in the absence of consensus. The TRM consensus process is different than the SAG consensus process. When there is not consensus in the TRM process, the IL-TRM Administrator makes a decision on what is included in the TRM, and that can be challenged in the TRM approval docket.
- Keith Cronin: The TRM policy document will have all details regarding non-consensus. It's important to decide on these policy issues quickly and into the TRM as early as possible, as there will likely be pertinent technical work for some measures. We will do our best to include these technical measures into the August 1<sup>st</sup> deliverable, but it will take time.

Abbi Miner: Can you explain the difference between a working group and a subcommittee?

• Celia Johnson: Yes, typically a subcommittee addresses longer term issues (like policy manual processes), which are then closed with the potential to be re-opened in the future as necessary. Some groups resulted due to stipulation language. Reporting

working groups are ongoing and discuss shorter-term issues such as market transformation.

- Abigail Miner: The differences aren't easily defined.
- Celia Johnson: There is a definition in the Policy Manual that gives "subcommittees" and "working groups" slight differences. We can think about calling them something else in the future.

# Feedback on 2024 SAG Planning Process

# Background

- 2024 focused on the <u>SAG Portfolio Planning Process</u>, with the objective of reaching consensus on Illinois utility EE Portfolio Plans for 2026-2029 prior to utilities filing EE Plans for approval with the ICC
- Large Group SAG Planning Process Jan. to Nov. 2024
  - o Overview of the Planning Process presented in January
  - o Utilities presented "deep dive" overviews of current EE Portfolios in February
  - Energy Efficiency ideas were submitted by interested SAG participants in March, and presented in April
  - Each utility presented a draft EE Plan overview to SAG in the fall, with an opportunity for any SAG participant to present feedback
- Collecting Feedback
- SAG Facilitator has held 9 meetings to discuss initial feedback on the 2024 SAG Planning Process, including:
  - Utilities
  - o Non-financially interested stakeholders that participated in negotiations
  - o IQ South Advisory Committee Facilitator
  - o SAG Steering Committee
- Slides 28-30 include a summary of key feedback about the 2024 <u>Large Group SAG</u> <u>Planning Process</u> and suggestions to consider for a future SAG Planning Process
  - o Feedback and suggestions are shared without attribution

- Feedback about the negotiation process was discussed with parties that participated in negotiations, and will not be summarized today
- Based on current law, the next 4-year EE Plans will be filed March 1, 2029; a future Planning Process would occur in 2028

# Summary of Initial Feedback on 2024 SAG Planning Process

#### 1. General Process Feedback

- Process was well organized, with information clearly communicated and useful templates provided.
- The Planning Process schedule flowchart was useful; consider an online tool to edit the flowchart as it changes, with a dedicated page for meeting dates.

# 2. Planning Process Timeline

• Additional time is needed – start the process earlier, in order to end earlier. Kick-off a future process at least 18 months before the statutory EE Plan filing deadline.

#### 3. Participation

- Holding a Large Group SAG meeting in-person for EE Plan presentations was useful.
- Plan and consider up-front how to ensure process includes an opportunity for Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) and Community Action Agencies (CAAs) to provide meaningful input, without being required to participate in a large number of meetings due to time and resource constraints.
- Request process feedback from stakeholders that submitted EE Ideas in March 2024.
- Clarify the role of ICC Staff and the ICC Office of General Counsel at the beginning of a future Planning Process.

#### 4. Energy Efficiency Ideas Process

- Collaboration on Energy Efficiency Idea submittals was appreciated; it was useful to have joint ideas submitted.
- Submitted ideas were not overly duplicative, which was appreciated.
- There were a smaller number of ideas submitted in 2024 vs. the 2020 process, which was more manageable.
- Include normative values with EE Idea proposals whenever possible (for example if the proposal is a about an increase of dollar amount, include the actual amount).

#### 5. Utility EE Plan Presentations to SAG

- Utilities should present draft EE Plans earlier.
- Utilities should include additional details in draft EE Plan presentations, instead of focusing on high level information
  - o What measures are included in each program for the 4-year EE Plan
  - o Administrative spending, including a budget breakdown
  - o Program budgets and savings associated with specific programs
  - o Consider sharing summary tables with draft EE Plan presentations
