CNTe Program Suggestion: COMPREMENSIVE MF Retrofit Program

A statewide MF Program that will offer comprehensive multi-family energy efficiency retrofits to achieve significant (20% or more) reduction in gas and electric energy use.








CNTe Program Features


- Common intake and Quality Assurance /Quality Control for all MF units, including:
 - Joint intake center for MF and joint marketing
 - -Gas and electric measures
 - Joint gas-electric funding with cost and savings allocation
- Addresses both affordable and higherincome



- Simplify the task of the building owner or municipality embarking on conservation
- Facilitate co-delivery of gas and electric retrofit services
- Reduce marketing and recruitment costs
- Generate demand among building owners
- Increase participation in MF retrofit programs

Energy Savers (Affordable Housing)

- WHO: buildings in Cook and Lake County IL with 5 or more units
- WHAT: energy audit plus financing assistance and construction oversight

Illinois Home Weatherization Assistance Program (Low-Income Housing)

- WHO: households that meet income requirements
- (landlord must agree to pay portion of costs)
- WHAT: energy audit and weatherization services

Energy Efficient Affordable Housing Construction Program

- WHO: Illinois based affordable housing developers building or rehabbing single-family, multi-family and Single Room Occupancy (SRO) buildings that are targeted to households at or below 80% Average Median Income (AMI).
- WHAT: grants to offset the additional materials and labors costs to include energy efficient measures in residential rehab or new construction (up to \$4,500 per living unit for multi-family buildings, \$4.50/ft2 of gross living space in SROs for buildings that will result in less than 80 units or \$4.25/ft2 of gross living space in SROs for buildings that will result in 80 units or more).

 - WHAT: free products that must be installed in each unit, including: water-conserving/saving shower heads, compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs), faucet aerators and water pipe insulation

Rationale for Approach: Current situation results in missed opportunities

Case Study: Constance Building

- 25 unit Multi-family affordable rental housing
- Report recommendations: insulation, air sealing, heating system upgrade and controls
- Total cost \$38,455 of project, financed at 2.5% by owner
