Policy Direction for this Document

- Five Dockets: 13-0195, 13-0498, 13-0499, 13-0549, 13-0550
- Policy Language the Commission notes that:
 - ...this directive is not to create entirely "new" NTG methodologies for every energy efficiency program, but rather to assess NTG methodologies and survey instruments that have been used to evaluate energy efficiency programs offered in Illinois, and to compile the most justifiable and well-vetted methodologies (or potentially combine certain components from the existing approaches to better represent the most justifiable and well-vetted method consistent with best practices) in an attachment to the Updated IL-TRM that would get submitted to the Commission for approval.
 - ...the IL-NTG Methods will be flexible and adaptable to multiple program designs and budgets and tailored to appropriately assess the specifics of each of the program administrators' energy efficiency programs, consistent with standard NTG methodologies adopted in other states that were filed in this proceeding.

 Standard/Prescriptive and Custom programs

Policy Context

- Has full text of Nicor's docket information as example of ICC directives
- Similar processes as IL-TRM:
 - Updating this NTG document follows same timeline updates completed by March 1 each year
 - ICC staff will submit staff report with the consensus Updated TRM attached with request for expedited review and approval (includes NTG document)
 - Non-consensus items similar to non-consensus items within IL-TRM



Attribution in General

Attribution in C&I and Public Sectors

- Agreements in document pertain to the self-report method
- Free ridership discussed extensively, but not yet fully
 - Several core agreements
 - Specific algorithm not yet determined
- Spillover not yet discussed



Attribution in Residential and Low Income Sectors

- Appliance Recycling
 - Follows the method that evaluators have applied in the past for IL
 - Includes basic and enhanced methods
 - Basic self-report of participants
 - Enhanced retailer survey, appliance market assessment, nonparticipant survey
- Residential Upstream Lighting
 - Follows method that evaluators have applied in the past two years for IL (self-report in-store intercepts)

- Information based on Uniform Methods Protocols, Chapter 17
- Presents eight different attribution methods
- Short description of each
- Additional 15 references around attribution (Uniform Methods Protocols has over 100 references)
