Threshold Issue 6: Allocation Across Programs

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#### Energy Efficiency Budget Allocations

#### Objective:

In the next three-year plan, Ameren Illinois will seek to allocate energy efficiency budgets across customer rate classes to maintain a similar bill impact for each rate class.

Current law limits electric bill impact to 2.015% and gas bill impact to 2.0%.

Therefore, Ameren Illinois will seek to keep a consistent 2.015% increase to electric rate classes and a 2.0% increase to gas rate classes as AIC sets its energy efficiency budgets for the next plan.

### Electric Budget Splits

- This approach would create a 40%/60% split between Residential and Business Customers
- It would also create a 65%/35% split between non competitively declared rate classes and competitively declared rate classes
