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BACKGROUND

CHICAGO BUNGALOW ASSOCIATION (CBA)

- Illinois 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation launched in September, 2000
- Dedicated to strengthening Chicago's bungalows and vintage homes through educational resources and energy efficiency grants
- 16,000+ person membership (it's free!)
- Over \$13.5 million energy efficiency grant dollars awarded since 2000





ENERGY SAVERS GRANT

FREE RETROFIT GRANT FOR LOW INCOME VINTAGE HOMEOWNERS IN CHICAGO

- Established in 2008
- Subsidized retrofits, leveraged funding
- Covers total air sealing & attic/wall/crawl space insulation measures
- Eligibility: 80% Area Median Income (AMI) and below vintage home, owner occupied
- Average savings/household:
 50% air infiltration reduction
 1,112,000 kWh
 2,374,120 Therms



2,780 RETROFITS COMPLETED SINCE 2008

1,700 OF THESE WERE COMPLETED USING DCEO FUNDING

BETWEEN 2016-2017 WE WILL HAVE COMPLETED AN ADDITIONAL 810 RETROFITS USING DCEO FUNDING


- 29,742 CHICAGO BUNGALOWS MAPPED
- 2,780 ENERGY SAVERS GRANTS DISTRIBUTED SINCE 2008





CBA targets these areas heavily.


NUMBER OF ENERGY SAVERS RECIPIENTS BY AGE

TRUST IS PARAMOUNT WITH THE WORK WE DO - A BARRIER FOR INSTITUTIONS

Energy Savers Grant work is invasive
Homeowners need to let us in their homes on multiple occasions
Homeowners need to share sensitive information with us

57% of all grant recipients heard about us through word-of-mouth from neighbors, family and friends!

OTHER BARRIERS

SOLVED

- Simplifying the application process
- Hand-holding when necessary (ex. help clearing cluttered attics)
- Front-end education (CBA)
- Back-end education of methods used (contractor to homeowner)
- Managing expectations
- Building relationship with contractor
- Eliminating homeowner copay/processing fee

UNSOLVED

- Structural issues ex. roof leaks
- Old mechanical systems
- Environmental mold/asbestos
- Crime
- Lack of internet access
- Other health & safety issues
- Unwilling to give up attic storage space

33% of Energy Savers Grant applications are rejected, declined or unresponsive
